CLUB HISTORY

2016 - PRESENT

The club was proposed by Colleen and Steve Allan in 2015. After community consultation and consultation with Surf Life Saving NSW, Bay and Basin Community Nippers Club Inc. was formed with the Constitution and Deed of Agreement being approved on 1 July 2016.

The club is based on the Community Club model first introduced in 2014 with the formation of the Bawley Point Kioloa Community Nippers Club.

Bay and Basin Community Nippers is closely aligned with the mission and values of Surf Life Saving New South Wales (SLS NSW). We are a non-competitive club that focuses on surf education.

The inaugural session was on Sunday, 24th October 2016, at Sailors Beach, Huskisson.

In October 2019, the club moved from Huskisson to Plantation Point, Vincentia.

We are entering our 9th Season.

- BBCNC Rash shirt
- Nippers' age group cap
- Named drink bottle
- Swimmers/wetsuits and towel
- Sunscreen (applied before arrival)
- Beach shoes/thongs (optional)

LINE UP, SIGN-IN, AND SIGN-OFF PROCEDURES

Children should line up in front of their Age Group flag on the large grass area, which is the designated starting point for Nippers' activities. Parents and caregivers need to sign their children in at the start of the session and sign them out at the end.

At the end of the session, all Age Groups must return to this area for signoff. Children should remove their caps once they have been signed out.


Note: Signing off on the beach is not allowed. If you need to leave early, please inform the Age Manager in advance.

ACTIVE PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT AND VOLUNTEER ASSISTANCE

Active parental involvement is highly encouraged. Parents and caregivers must remain near the group at all times and are welcome to assist as needed, including providing potential water-related support.

Please take your children to the toilet when necessary to minimise disruptions.

We welcome your volunteer services and talents to assist the club when possible. Parents, especially those with younger groups, may be required to enter the water or provide support in various ways. Please come prepared for such involvement.



PROMOTING SAFETY, RESPECT, AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Treat all participants with kindness and respect, following the golden rule of treating others as you would like to be treated. Encourage a positive and supportive atmosphere by applauding all good performances and efforts. Please assist in maintaining the equipment provided for the benefit of all. We expect all Nippers to help pack up, including washing down the boards.

Please emphasise the importance of safety and respect with your child, reminding them to play by the rules, follow instructions, and listen to Age Managers and the Water Safety Crew. Please show your appreciation for our dedicated volunteers, including Age Managers, Water Safety Personnel, First Aid Team, BBQ Crew, and Committee Members, who generously give their time for your child's benefit.

FUNDRAISING

Bay and Basin Community Nippers Club operates as a non-profit organisation, relying on various funding sources to sustain its operations. These sources include grants, sponsorship, and, most significantly, fundraising initiatives. Fundraising plays a pivotal role in ensuring the continued success of our surf lifesaving club, allowing us to maintain and/or purchase essential equipment. Below, we have outlined some of the activities we encourage all our members to participate in actively:

- BBQs: These gatherings occur every Sunday. This is coordinated by the BBQ Coordinator and facilitated by parents/guardians. For further details, please refer to the Age Group Roster and the appendix.
- Additional Fundraising Events: We organise various fundraising events throughout the season. This includes a Bunnings BBQ, a raffle and Age Group Photos.
- Sponsorship Opportunities: If you know any businesses or individuals who may be interested in sponsoring our Nippers program, please don't hesitate to contact our committee.

Your active engagement in these fundraising activities helps us secure the necessary resources and fosters a strong sense of community within our club. We greatly appreciate your support, which allows us to continue our mission of saving lives and promoting beach safety.



AGE GROUP ROSTER

Each week, an Age Group will be assigned to assist with BBQ and pack-up duties. The BBQ Coordinator will handle the purchase of supplies.

BBQ Duties:

Volunteers are needed to help run the BBQ from 9:30 am to approximately 12:00 pm. Responsibilities include:

- Setting up the BBQ area
- · Prepping and cooking the food
- Serving the food
- Managing the cashier
- · Packing up at the end

Duties can be divided among different adults who may rotate in and out as needed.

Meeting Area Pack-Up (after all groups are back):

- Wash all rescue boards and stack them near the trailer
- Pack the trailer according to the Gear Steward's instructions
- Place Nippers' tubs in the trailer
- Collect all sign-in folders, pack the admin table, and place the items near the President's car.
- Remove flags and place them in the trailer
- Fold up tables and tarps
- Store First Aid equipment in the trailer



JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT AWARDS

As part of the Nippers program, children have the opportunity to gain a junior development award each season; each member should be encouraged to attain their respective age award.

- U8 Surf Aware 1
- U9 Surf Aware 2
- U10 Surf Safe 1
- U11 Surf Safe 2
- U12 Surf Smart 1
- U13 Surf Smart 2 (includes Resuscitation Certificate)
- U14 Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC)

As Surf Education is delivered throughout the season, it is important to ensure your child is attending Nippers regularly to ensure they aren't missing out on key aspects of these awards.

END OF SEASON CLUB AWARDS

Each season, Bay and Basin Community Nippers Club Inc. recognises the outstanding achievement of our Nippers at our end-of-season presentation day. The awards aim not only to recognise achievement in surf sports but also to acknowledge participation in the Nipper program and reward those Nippers who exemplify our Club values.

Each child will receive a participation medal, and two children from each age group will be awarded either the Allrounder or a Most Improved Award.





The Cameron Burke 'Club Spirit' Shield is a perpetual award. It is presented to a member who has consistently exemplified the core values and ethos of the club, demonstrating qualities such as mateship, teamwork, dedication, and an unwavering commitment to the club's mission and objectives. This shield serves as a symbol of honour and recognition, acknowledging the outstanding contributions and character of the recipient.
